This bond act authorizes the State to issue bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$500 million. The money from the sale of the bonds would be used to provide grants to schools, school districts, county vocational school districts, and county colleges. Money from the grants would be used to build, equip, and expand facilities to increase career and technical education program capacity. Money would also be used for school security upgrades and school district water infrastructure improvement projects.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT</p> <p>This act would allow the State to borrow a total principal amount of \$500 million. This money would be used to provide grants to county vocational school districts and county colleges to construct and equip buildings to increase capacity in career and technical education programs. The money would also be used to provide grants for school security projects at kindergarten through grade 12 schools. The money would also be used to provide grants for school district water infrastructure improvement projects. Three hundred fifty million dollars would support county vocational school district projects and school security projects. Fifty million dollars would support county college projects. One hundred million dollars would support school district water infrastructure improvement projects.</p>

INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOTING

- 1** PRESS THE  BUTTON TO THE RIGHT OF THE CANDIDATE OF YOUR CHOICE; A **GREEN ARROW** WILL APPEAR SIGNIFYING YOUR SELECTION.
- 2** TO VOTE IN FAVOR OF A PROPOSITION OR PROPOSAL, PRESS THE  BUTTON TO THE RIGHT OF THE WORD “YES”. TO VOTE AGAINST THE PROPOSITION OR PROPOSAL, PRESS THE  BUTTON TO THE RIGHT OF THE WORD “NO”. A **GREEN ARROW** WILL APPEAR NEXT TO YOUR SELECTION.
- 3** **TO CHANGE ANY SELECTION**, PRESS THE  BUTTON AGAIN. THE **GREEN ARROW** WILL DISAPPEAR AND YOU MAY MAKE A NEW SELECTION.
- 4** AFTER YOU HAVE COMPLETED ALL YOUR SELECTIONS, THEN PRESS THE  BUTTON LOCATED IN THE LOWER RIGHT HAND CORNER OF THE MACHINE. THIS ELECTRONICALLY RECORDS ALL YOUR VOTES.
- 5** PART THE CURTAINS AND EXIT THE VOTING BOOTH.

WARNING that an improperly cast write-in vote will be void and not counted. When choosing a **personal choice (write-in)**, whatever **office** you choose to put in a personal choice for, that is the only office to which the vote will be counted. Any improperly cast vote will not be counted. Please read the face of the ballot carefully before taking this option. Should you have any questions regarding the personal choice, please ask the district board worker before entering the voting booth.

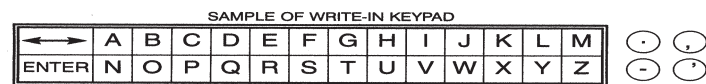
PERSONAL CHOICE (WRITE-IN) INSTRUCTIONS

- 1** UPON ENTERING THE VOTING BOOTH, LOCATE THE OFFICE YOU WISH TO VOTE FOR (OFFICES WILL BE LISTED AT THE TOP OF THE BALLOT) AND FOLLOW THIS COLUMN DOWN TO THE PERSONAL CHOICE COLUMN AND PRESS THE BUTTON.
- 2** A GREEN “←” ARROW WILL BEGIN TO FLASH. (NOTE: THE “←” WILL CONTINUE TO FLASH UNTIL THE WRITE-IN IS COMPLETED).
- 3** AT THE BOTTOM OF THE BALLOT IS THE MAROON WRITE-IN PAD, WHICH IS APPROXIMATELY WAIST HIGH. TYPE IN THE FIRST NAME OF THE CANDIDATE FOR WHOM YOU WISH TO VOTE, USE THE ARROW KEY FOR THE SPACE, AND THEN TYPE IN THE LAST NAME. NOW PRESS “ENTER” WHICH IS LOCATED ON THE PAD.

IF AN ERROR ON THE WRITE-IN IS MADE—BEFORE YOU PRESS ENTER ON THE WRITE-IN KEYPAD—PRESS THE ARROW KEY TO THE LEFT UNTIL THE ERROR IS CLEARED AND THEN RE-TYPE THE NAME. TO MAKE A SPACE—PRESS THE ARROW KEY TO THE RIGHT.

AFTER YOU HAVE COMPLETED VOTING THE ENTIRE BALLOT, PRESS THE ORANGE “CAST VOTE” BUTTON LOCATED ON YOUR LOWER RIGHT-HAND SIDE.

DO NOT PRESS THE CAST VOTE BUTTON UNTIL YOU ARE SURE YOU ARE FINISHED VOTING.

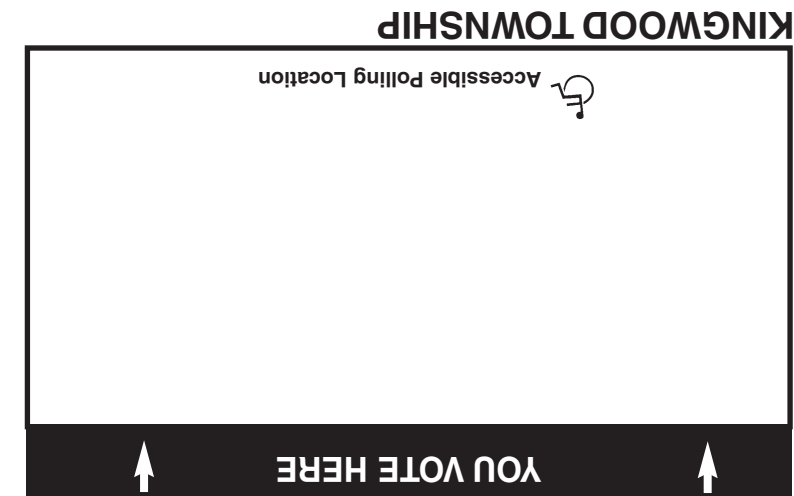
You may authorize a messenger to appear at the County Clerk's Office with your completed Application for Vote by Mail Ballot.
