Finally, after you have established a recycling program for your organization, the next important thing to do is report the information to your municipal recycling coordinator. By doing this, your organization and your municipality will get the credit for the recycling. Please contact the municipal recycling coordinator at the following telephone numbers.

**ARE THERE ANY OTHER
MATERIALS THAT CAN BE
RECYCLED?**

Yes, many other recycling opportunities exist for items that may be disposed by your organization. Established, viable markets exist for the recycling of diverse items such as food waste, leaves, and electronics.

CHANGES IN RECYCLING REQUIREMENTS!

ADDITIONAL MATERIALS REQUIRED TO BE RECYCLED BY BUSINESSES & INSTITUTIONS IN HUNTERDON COUNTY

The items that each business & institution in the County are required to recycle have been expanded from just newspaper, glass, aluminum cans, office paper and cardboard. Each business and institution must also recycle -

- **Other Paper/Magazines/Junk Mail** - All paper, which is not defined, as corrugated, mixed office paper, computer paper or newspaper.
- **Plastic Containers** - Containers such as polyethylene terephthalate (PETE - #1) soda bottles, high-density polyethylene and (HDPE - #2) milk, water, or detergent.
- **White Goods and Light Iron** - All appliances such as washers, dryers, refrigerators, etc. as well as products made from sheet iron such as shelving, file cabinets, metal desks, recycled or reconditioned steel drums, and other non-structural ferrous scrap.

- **Anti-freeze** - All automotive engine coolant consisting of a mixture of ethylene glycol and water or propylene glycol and water.
- **Batteries, Lead-Acid** - Batteries from automobiles, trucks, other vehicles and machinery and equipment. THIS DOES NOT INCLUDE CONSUMER BATTERIES.
- **Used Motor Oil** - petroleum-based or synthetic oil which, through use, storage or handling, has become unsuitable for its original purpose due to the presence of impurities or loss of original properties.
- **Tires** - Rubber-based scrap automotive, truck or specialty (e.g. forklift) tires. The tires must be recycled at a facility approved by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.
- **Steel Cans** - Rigid containers made exclusively or primarily of steel or tin-plated steel and steel and aluminum cans used to store food, beverages, and a variety of other household and consumer products.

RECYCLING SAVES MONEY!

With the high cost of waste disposal in New Jersey and readily available recycling opportunities, now is the time to take to start or improve your organization's recycling efforts. While recycling is the law in New Jersey, recycling can also reduce your waste and your expenses.

In many cases, the recycling of materials costs less than disposing of the same materials as waste.

HOW TO GET STARTED

Many of the companies collecting solid waste (garbage) in Hunterdon also provide business and institutional recycling collection services. If your organization doesn't yet have a recycling program, contact your solid waste company, municipality, the Hunterdon County Division of Solid Waste & Recycling, or the State Office of Recycling for more information about starting a recycling program.
