Face Coverings For Hunterdon Farm Workers Ensures Uninterrupted And Safe Food Sources

The Hunterdon County Rutgers Cooperative Extension Office is working with the County Board of Agriculture and state offices in making available and distributing face coverings to farms and seasonal farm workers to protect the health of essential and vulnerable populations while harvesting crops, Freeholder John E. Lanza reported at the August 4th Hunterdon County Freeholder Board meeting.

Freeholder Lanza, the Board's liaison for Agriculture, reported, "Protecting farms and farm workers ensures that fresh, local food continues to be available to grocers, farm markets, food banks and restaurants. Putting safety measures in place has contributed towards providing uninterrupted food sources from local farms throughout the pandemic."

Lanza said, "This is an excellent public health initiative that is very important in Hunterdon County where agriculture is a driving force in our economy. I congratulate the Rutgers Extension team and the County's Agriculture Board for their efforts to protect farm workers.
