

Were you impacted by Tropical Storm Ida?



Disaster Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (D-SNAP) provides food assistance benefits to individuals and families not enrolled in SNAP who live in certain municipalities affected by Tropical Storm Ida.

HOW DO I KNOW IF I'M ELIGIBLE?

To be eligible for D-SNAP, for the month of September you must:

- Have been living in one of the listed municipalities on September 1, 2021
- Have disaster-related expenses
- Not already receive SNAP benefits
- Have income and resources below the maximum limit for the number of people in your household

For a household of three, the income limit is **\$3,919**.

Income limit is net income received in September 2021 added to liquid resources, such as bank accounts.

HOW DO I SIGN UP FOR D-SNAP?

Apply in person at your board of social services during business hours from November 15-19.

Locations and hours can be found on the "Using Your Benefits" page of www.njsnap.gov.

When applying for D-SNAP, you will need to show:

- Photo ID or two documents that verify your identity
- Proof of residency as of September 1, 2021. This can include: utility bills, tax bills, insurance policy, driver's license or other official documents to establish your home address

You may be asked to verify your household composition, disaster-related expenses and income and resources.

HOW MUCH WILL I RECEIVE IN BENEFITS?

Eligible households will receive a one-month food assistance benefit on an **Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT)** card. The amount depends on the number of people in your household.
